RECIPE OF THE MONTH:

Pizza Casserole

Ingredients:

- 2 cups uncooked egg noodles
- 1/2 pound lean ground beef
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minces
- 1 green bell pepper, chopped
- 1 cup of pepperoni slices
- 16 ounces pizza sauce
- 4 tablespoons milk
- 1 cup shredded mozzarella cheese

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees
2. Cook noodles according to package directions.
3. In a medium skillet over medium-high heat, brown the ground beef with the onion, garlic and green bell pepper. Drain excess fat. Stir in the noodles, pepperoni, pizza sauce and milk, and mix well. Pour this mixture into a 2-quart casserole dish.
4. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes, top with cheese, then bake for 5 to 10 more minutes.

The fun thing about this recipe is you can customize the casserole, the same as you would customize your pizza. If you like green peppers, mushrooms and olives, then add them to the casserole!

PLEASE PICK UP AFTER YOUR PETS!

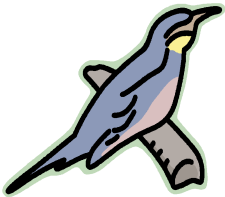


As our grounds crew has been mowing and trimming lawns and common areas around the community they have found that people haven't been picking up after their animals.

- Pour four cups of hot water into a large pot.
- Add one cup of table sugar (do not use sugar substitute).
- Stir until all sugar has dissolved.
- Cover the pan and bring the mix to a rolling boil for 1-2 minutes.
- Let the mix cool and pour into a well-cleaned feeder.

Time to start washing those RVs

A good spring wash will help bring the shine out of everyone's unit. Below are a few tips that might help.

- Add about 1/3 cup of plain white vinegar to your wash bucket the next time you wash your RV (or car). The vinegar helps prevent water spotting and boosts the cleansers as well.
- Don't use dish soap as an RV cleaner. It is too harsh and can harm paint and finishes. Use a cleaner specifically formulated for RVs.
- Wax your RV every 3 months. By waxing regularly road grime will have a more difficult time sticking to the finish.
- Never use polyester or microfiber cloths to clean your RV. Even though they may seem soft, polyester is essentially created from plastic. Polyester fibers are tougher than cotton and can eventually mar your finish and rub the sealant off your vehicle.

Cleaning your RV will take some time. But taking care of your RV is an investment that can pay off if you choose to resell in the future!
